Calendar of consultations on the medium-term plan for the period starting in 1992**

Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

Introduction

- 1. At its rerwined twenty-seventh session, the Committee for Programme d Co-ordination (CPC) recommended that the next medium-term plan cover the period starting in 1992 and be considered by the General Assembly in 1990. In this connection, it recommended that the Secretary-General submit to it at its twenty-eighth session a calendar of consultations with the intergovernmental bodies concerned for the preparation of the various chapters of the next medium-term plan. 1/ There recommendations were endorsed by the General Assembly in resolution 42/215.
- 2. In the same rrrolution the General Assembly adopted the amendments recommended by CPC to the Regulation8 Governing Programme Planning, the Programme Aspects of the Budget, the Monitoring of Implementation and the Methods of Evaluation (hereinafter referred to as the programme planning regulations). 2/ The amendments incorporate the provisions of General Assembly resolution 41/213 aimed, inter alia, at improving the consultative process for the formulation of the medium-term plan.

The programme planning regulations and the relevant proviriona of Assembly resolutions 41/213 and 42/215 provide that the consultative process for the preparation of the next medium-term plan will include:

- (a) Submission of the introduction to thr plan, which constitutes an integral element in the planning process, to Member States for wide consultations (regulation 3.1);
- (b) Conrideration of the draft introduction to the plan by CPC at its twenty-eighth session (General Assembly resolution 42/215);
- (c) Drawing up by the Secretary-General, in consultation with CPC and the Advisory Connittee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ), of a calendar of conrultation regarding the major programmes in the plan with the sectoral, technical, regional and central bodies in the United Nations (regulation 3.1);
- (d) Review of the chapters of the proposed plan by the sectoral, functional and regional bodian of the United Nations, if possible during the regular cycle of their meetings (regulation 4.12);
- (e) Prior consultations on the plan with the specialised agencies (regulation 4.13);
- (f) Review of the proposed plan by CPC, the Economic and Social Council, the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) (regulation 4.12) and the Committee on Conferences, in accordance with their terms of referencer
- (g) Conrideration of the propored plan by the General Assembly at its forty-fifth session in thr light of the comments and recommendations of the Economic and Social Council, CPC, ACABQ (regulation 4.14) and the Committee on Conferences.
- 3, The proposals for a calendar of consultations that follow are designed to meet these legislative requirements. In this regard, it should be recalled that in resolutions 41/213 and 42/215, the Assembly stressed the need to implement fully all the provisions of the programme planning regulations and the related rules, It should be noted that the proposals are made on the basis of the projected meeting schedule of the existing sectoral, functional and regional bodies and the current structure of the medium-term plan for the period 1984-1989.

Past experience in drawing up a calendar of consultations

4. At its twentieth session, CPC reviewed a draft calendar for thr preparation at the medium-term plan for the period 1984-1989 on the basis of a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/4 and Corr.1). That report concidered the scope for the full involvement of the sectoral, regional and contral organs and of their subsidiary bodies. Consideration was given to the possibility of rescheduling meetings of the intergovernmental bodies concerned and, in cases where the meeting schedule could not be altered, to the possibility of setting up ad hoc planning committees.

5, It was concluded that, by and large, sectoral and regional bodies were aver86 to rescheduling their meetings for the purpose of considering draft chapters of the plan, Setting up ad hog planning committees was found to be a practical alternative. CPC concurred in these assessments and conaluded that the

"full involvement of all intergovernmental organs in the formulation and review of the plan war desirable and important, however, this could not justify an extensive rescheduling of the calendar of meetings, since their substantive activities might be disrupted by a change in their calendar of work". 1/

CPC also agreed that organ8 might delegate the review of the plan to ad hoc bodies, if they eo wished.

Practical constraints

- 6. The purpose of the preparatory and consultative process is to enable the General Assembly to approve the medium-term plan at its forty-fifth session, which will be hold during September-December 1990. CPC will review the draft plan at its thirtieth session, which, on the basis of normal expectations, will be held between the end of April and the boginning of Juae 1990, CPC will advise on the calendar of consultations at its twenty-eighth session (25 April-3 Juno 1988). Consequently, the timetable for consultations murt have June 1988 and April 1990 as the extreme parameters. In addition, a number of technical and practical considerations must be taken into account in drawing up the calendar.
- 7. For the consultations with sectoral, functional and regional bodies to begin, there begins will need to have begins their deliberations may take place within an overall framework. Consultations on the introduction to the plan were initiated with the submission by the Secretary-General to CPC at its twenty-seventh session of the paper entitled "Some perspectives on the work of the United Nations in the 1990s" (see A/42/512), which was subsequently considered by the General Assembly at its forty-second session. The Assembly requested the Secretary-General to gather additional comments from Mombor States and to take into account all views expressed by Member States when submitting the draft introduction. The draft introduction to the plan will be before CPC at its twenty-eighth session.
- 8. Following the deliberations of CPC at its twenty-eighth session, the Offico for Programme Planning, Budget and Finance will need some time to prepare and circulate the instructione for the preparation of the plan, The eccretariat unite responsible for the individual chapters of the plan will then need time to prepare and circuleto the draft chapters to the relevant organs. After the concentrationa with the acctoral, functional and regional bodies, the central secretariat services will require three months to review and put together eubmiceione received from the Secretariat unite receponrible for individual chapters of the plan, If the plan is to be issued six weeks in advance of the session of CPC, it must be rubmitted for editing, translation and reproduction by early 1990. Thus, concultatione with sectoral, functional and regional bodies must take place between January and mid-September 1989,

Feasibility of consultations with sectoral, functional and regional bodies during the regular cycle of their meetings

- 9. An examination of the planned schedule of the sectoral, functional and regional bodies during January-September 1989 in relation to the major programmes of the current medium-term plan, as shown in annexes I and II, indicates that moot of the major programmes in thr plan would be outlired to review by the bodies concerned except those for which no specialised programme-reviewing body exists (and for which CPC, ACABQ or the Committee on Conferences therefore must exercise direct responsibility). Only the programme areas of new and renewable sources of energy (programme 11) and crime prevention and control (programme 21) would not be covered because the relevant bodies (Committee on the Development and Utilisation of New and Renewable Sources of Energy and Committee on Crime Prevention and Control) are not scheduled to most in 1989. It should be noted that the calendar of meetings may change as a result of the Economic and Social Council's review of the intergovernmental otruoturo in thr roonomia and social fields and that a decision is still to be taken on the format. content and presentation of the next medium-term plan.
- There would appear to be two methods of dealing with these gaps. One method would be for CPC again to ● ndoroo the ● otabliohmont by the organs concerned of adhoc blanning sodies to review draft chapters of the plan. havo financial implicationo, In view of the current financial situation of the Organization, the Secretary-General is not in a position to recommend such a course Anothor method would be for the substantive secretariat units concerned to circulate the draft chapter of the plan, as prepared by them, together with its introduction, to the members of the relevant programme-reviewing body for views end suggestions. The draft ahaptrro would be reformulated by the Secretariat units on the basis of the comments received. This method would not be entirely satisfactory, since 1t would preclude dialogue among members of the bodies concerned and would leave a large area ogon to interpretation by the Secretariat Nevertheless, since Member States would still have the opportunity to make their views known through their representatives in CPC, the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly, this method is the one favoured by the Secretary-General.

Prior consultations with the specialized agencies

Progromms planning regulation 4.13 states that "the activities in the medium-term plan shall be co-ordinated with those of the concrned specialized agencies through prior consultations", and rule 104.13 (b) otatoo that "medium-term plan proposals shall be circulated to the specialized agencies in accordance with the agreed procedures for prior concollations in time for their comments to be taken into account by the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination", The Secretary-General believes that therm would be merit in including the sectoral, functioning and regional bodies in the process of prior consultations with the goncies. It is suggested, therefore, that the United Notions Secretariat units concorned should circulate the draft chapters of the plon to the interested agencies at the same time as they are circulated to the members of the interested agencies would

be made available by the Secretariat to the sectoral, functional and regional bodiro concerned. At a later stage, the draft plan as a whale would be circulated to specialised agencies, and any comments would be transmitted to CPC.

Proposed calendar of consultations

Recommendations

- 13. The Secretary-General recommends that the Committee:
- (a) Agree that the preparation of thr next medium-term plan should proceed on the basis of the calendar of consultations proposed in paragraph 12 above;
- (b) Authorise him to issue thr instructions for thr preparation of the medium-term plan on the barir of the draft introduction submitted to CPC at its twenty-eighth session, ACABQ and the Economic and Social Council at its second regular session of 1988 and the results of the discussions thereon, on the understanding that supplementary instructions would be issued, as necessary, in thr light of the deliberations of the General Assembly at its forty-third session;
- (a) Authorise him to submit to the sectoral, functional and regional bodies the introduction to thr medium-term plan together with the relevant draft chapters;
- (d) Recommend that the General Assembly request the sectoral, functional and regional bodies to recommend priorities among subprogrammes in their field of competence, in accordance with programme planning regulations 4.2 and 4.16, in the light of the priorities set in the introduction to the plan,
- (•) Authoriro him to conduct annrultation by corrorpondence with members of those rootoral, functional and regional bodies whose meeting schedule doer not permit them to review the draft chapters of the plan;
- (f) Endorse his proposal that the procedure for prior consultations with the specialised agencies should be extended to the rootoral, functional and regional bodies of thr United Nations.
