Resumption of ration distribution to Paleatine refugees

Report of the Secretary-General

1. The present report is oubmitted to the General Assembly in pursuance of its resolution 42/69 F of 2 Doaombor 1987, the operative paragraphs of which road as follows.

"The General Assembly,

....

"1. <u>Regrets</u> that its resolutions 37/120 F, 38/83 F, 39/99 F, 40/165 F and 41/69 F hrvo not been implemented;

"2. <u>Calls once sgain upon all</u> Governments, as a matter of urgency, to make the most generous efforts possible rnd to offer the necessary resources to meet the needs of the United Nations Relief rnd Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East, particularly in the light of the interruption by the Agency of the gonoral ration distribution to Palestine refugees in all fields, and thereforr urges non-contributing Governments to contribute regularly and contributing Governments to consider increasing their regular contributions;

"3. <u>Reguests</u> the Commissioner-General of the Unitod Nations Relief rnd Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East to resume on a continuing basis the Interrupted general ration distribution to Palestine refugees in all fields;

"4. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General, in consultation with the Commissioner-General, to report to the General Assembly at its forty-third session on the implementation of the present resolution."

2. The Agency has continued to distribute rations to the most needy rector of the refugee population, special hardship cases, who numbered 119,512 persons in December 1987.

3. The Agency has provided • morgonoy food assistance in Lebanon and in the Israeli occupied territories of the West Bank and the Gasa Strip, Two dirtributionr of food were made to all registered refugees in Lebanon in 1957 and several ad hog dirtributionr were made to camp inhabitant8 and others affected by the fighting around the camps. In the West Bank, food supplies have been distributed in camps and other areas where refugees have concentrated as the need arises and as conditions permit. Food commodities have also boon dirtributrd through rome 87,000 school children in the Gasa Strip. Food will continue to be distributed in ril three placer • u long as the need remains and supplies are available.

4. Owing to continuing financial constraints, it has not been possible to resume the general ration distribution to all refugees.
