FINANCING OF THE UNITED NATIONS PEACE-REEPING FORCES IN THE MIDDLE EAST: UNITED NATIONS INTERIMFORCE IN LEBANON

Report of the Fifth Committee

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. At it8 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1988, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of it8 forty-third session, and to allocate to the Fifth Committee, tho item entitled,
 - "Financing of the United Nation8 peace-keeping forces in the Middle East:
 - "(a) United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force;
 - "(b) United Nation8 Intrrim Force in Lebanon".
- 2. The Fifth Committee considered rub-item (b) of agenda item 124 at its 45th meeting, on 12 December 1988. It had before it the report of the Secretary-Qrneral on the financing of the United Nations InterimForce in Lrbanon (A/43/826 and Corr.1) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/43/941).
 - II. CONSIDERATION FORAFT RESOLUTION A/C.5/43/L.7
- 3. At the 45th meeting, on 12 December, the representative of Ireland introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/43/L.7)sponsored by Austria, Canada, Denmark, Fiji, Finland, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, Ghana, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Lebanon, Nepal, New Zealand, Norway, Samoa and Sweden, subsequently joined by the Netherlands. He orally amended the resolution by replacing the fifth preambular paragraph by the following two paragraphs:

"Taking into account the fact that the economically more developed countries are in a position to make relatively larger contributions and that the economically less developed countries have a relatively limited capacity to contribute towards peace-keeping operations involving heavy expenditures,

"Bearing in mind the special responsibilities of the States permanent members of the Security Council in the financing of such operations, as indicated in General Assembly resolution 1874 (S-IV) of 27 June 1963 and other resolutions of the Assembly".

4. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted the draft resolution, as orally revised, by a recorded vote of 103 to 1, with 7 abstentions (see **para.** 6). The voting was as follows:

5. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this sub-item are reflected in the relevant summary record (see A/C.5/43/SR.45).

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

6. The Fifth Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Financing of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon

The General Assembly,

Having considered the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the UnitedNations Interim Force in Lebanon 1/ and thr related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 2/

Bearinginmind Security Council resolution 425 (1978) of 19 March 1978, by which the Council established the United Nation8 Interim Force in Lebanon, and the subsequent resolutions by which the Council extended the mandate of the Force, the latest of which was resolution 617 (1988) of 29 July 1988,

Recalling its resolution S-8/2 of 2.1 April 1978, on the financing of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon and its rubrequent resolutions thereon, the latest of which was resolution 42/223 of 2.1 December 1967.

Reaffirming its previous decisions regarding the fact that, in order to meet the expenditure; caused by ruch operation, a different procedure from the one applied to meet expenditures of the regular budget of the United Nation is required.

Taking into account the fact that thr economically more developed counttier are in a position to make relatively larger contribution8 and that the economically less developed countries have a relatively limited capacity to contribute towards praor-keeping operations involving heavy expenditures,

Bearing in mind the special responsibilities of thr States permanent members of the Security Council in the financing of such operations, as indicated in General Assembly resolution 1874 (O-IV) of 27 June 1963 and other resolutions of the Assembly,

Having regard to the financial position of the Special Account for the United NationsInterimForce in Lebanon, as set forth in the report of the Secretary-General, 1/ and referring to paragraph 18 of the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 2/

Recalling its resolution 34/9E of 17 December 1979 and rubrequent resolution 6 which suspended the provisions of regulations 5.2 (b), 5.2 (d), 4.3 and 4.4 of the Financial Regulationa of the United Nationr, the latest of which was resolution 42/223,

Mindful of the fact that it is essential to provide the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon with the necessary financial resources to enable:

to fulfilits responsibilities under the relevant resolutions of the Security Council,

Noting with appreciation that voluntary contributions have been made to the United Nationr Interim Force in Lebanon by certain Governments,

<u>Concerned</u> that the Secretary-General is continuing to face increasing difficulties in meeting the obligations of the United Nationr Interim Force in Lebanon on a current basis, including reimbursement to current and former troop-contributing Staten, resulting from the withholding of contributions by certain Member States,

Concerned that the surplus balances in the Special Account for the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon have, in effect, been drawn upon to the full extent to supplement the income received from contributions for meeting expenses of the Force,

Concerned also that the application of the provisions of regulations 5.2 (2), 5.2 (2), 4.3 and 4.4 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations would aggravate the already difficult financial rituation of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon.

- 1. <u>Decides</u> to appropriate to the **Special** Account referred to in rection I, paragraph 1, of General Assembly rerolution S-8/2 an amount of \$141,180,000 authorised by paragraph 3 of Arrembly rerolution 42/223 for the operation of the United NationsInterim Force in Lebanon from 1 February 1966 to 31 January 1969, inclusive;
- 2. <u>Decides</u>, as an <u>ad hoc</u> arrangement, without prejudice to the positions of principle that may be taken by Member States in any consideration by the General Assembly of arrangements for the financing of peace-keeping operations, to apportion the amount of \$141,180,000 among Member States in accordance with the scheme ret out in Assembly rerolution 33/14 of 3 November 1978 and the provisions of rection V, paragraph 1, of rerolution 34/9 B of 17 December 1979, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 35/115 A of 10 December 1980, section VI, paragraph 1, of rerolution 36/138 A of 16 December 1981, section IX, paragraph 1, of rerolution 37/127 A of 17 December 1982, and section VII, paragraphs 1 and 2 of resolution 35/71 A of 13 December 1984; the scale of assessments for the year 1988 3/2 shall be applied against a portion thereof, that is, \$129,415,000 being the amount pertaining on a pro-rate basis to the period from 1 February to 31 December 1966 inclusive, and the scale of assessments for the year 1969 4/

shall be applied against the balance, that is, \$11,765,000 for the period

- 3. <u>Decides</u> that there rhall beset off against the apportionment among Member States, as provided in paragraph 2 above, their respective share in tha estimated income of \$20,000 other than staff assessment income approved for the period from 1 February 1985 to 31 January 1959, inclusive;
- 4. <u>Decides</u> that, in accordance with the provisions of it8 resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, there shall be set off against the apportionment among Member States, as provided for in paragraph 2 above, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund of thr 8timat.d staffassessmentincome Of \$1,744,000 approved for the period from 1 Fabruary 1988 to 31 January 1989, inclusive;
- 5. Authorises the Secretary-General to enter into commitments for the operation of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon at a rate not to exceed \$11,903,500 gross (\$11,714,500 net) per month for the 12-month period beginning 1 February 1959, should the Security Council decide to continue the Force beyond the period of six months authorized under its resolution 617 (1988), the raid amount to be apportioned among Member States in accordance with the scheme ret out in the present resolution and the scale of assessments for the years 1989 and 1990;
- 6. Decides that the provisions of regulations 5.2 (h), 5.2 (d), 4.3 and 4.4 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nation8 shall be suspended in respect of the amount of \$6,313,362, which otherwise would have to be surrendered pursuant to those provisions, this amount to be entered in the account referred to in the operative part of General Assembly resolution 34/9 E and held in suspense until a further decision is taken by the Assembly;
- 7. Requests the Secretary-General to take all necessary measures to ensure that the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon shall be administered with a maximum of efficiency and economy)
- 8. Renews it8 invitation to Member States and other interested parties to make voluntary contributions of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon both in mash and in the form of services and supplies acceptable to the Secretary-General and also to make voluntary contributions in cash to the Suspense Account established in accordance with resolution 34/9 D of 17 December 1979.
