NOTE VERBALE DATED 1 APRIL 1966 FROM THE ALTERNATE REPRESENTATIVE OF
CHILE ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Alternate Representative of Chile to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to his note No. PO 230 SORH (1) of 29 November 1965, has the honour to inform him of the following:

"The Government of Chile has duly taken note of General Assembly resolution 2024 (XX) of 11 November 1965 and of Security Council resolutions 216 and 217 of 12 November and 20 November 1965, respectively, concerning the present situation in Southern Rhodesia.

"The Government of Chile is deeply concerned at the situation that has arisen in Southern Rhodesia as a result of the unilateral declaration of independence and, in conformity with the above-mentioned resolutions, has taken the necessary administrative measures to prevent citizens of Chile from trading with Southern Rhodesia.

"It will also take any other measures that circumstances require to give effect to the above-mentioned General Assembly and Security Council resolutions."

The Alternate Representative of Chile requests the Secretary-General to have the text of this note circulated as an official document of the General Assembly and of the Security Council.
