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An Entrepreneurship Model for Poverty Reduction with an Environmental Conservation Approach (Sustainable development)

Mr. President,

Nowadays non-fair education and job opportunities are one of the most effective factors which lead to the widespread poverty and hunger over the world.

Labours are working for almost unlimited time, but earn limited money, i.e. imbalance of working time and income. Learning no profession and finding no basis to train their talent, fake jobs are most welcome in suburban areas.

According to the negative impacts of fake jobs, e.g. begging on kids, Imam Ali's Popular Students Relief Society (IASPRS) was decided to define an entrepreneurship project to follow below targets:
