REPORT ON CONTRIBUTIONS BY MEMBER STATES TO
REGULAR RESOURCES AND CO-FINANCING ARRANGEMENTS
FOR 2006 AND FUTURE YEARS

Report of the Executive Director

Introduction

- 1. This report is prepared in response to Executive Board decisions 99/5 and 2000/9, which requested the Executive Director to provide annually updated estimates of regular resources and other resources from co-financing arrangements, in the multi-year funding framework (MYFF). Since the introduction of the MYFF in 2000, UNFPA has been actively campaigning for, and receiving, pledges on a continuous basis, not only for the current year, but for future years as well. The purpose of the present report is to promote dialogue between UNFPA and its Executive Board on the Fund's overall resource situation while continuing to address the common and important goal of increasing regular resources and achieving a stable and predictable resource base.
- 2. The 2005 World Summit reaffirmed that individuals and couples must have universal access to reproductive health by 2015. Such a target will need to be integrated into national strategies to attain the internationally agreed development goals, including those contained in the Millennium Declaration, aimed at reducing maternal mortality, improving maternal health, reducing child mortality, promoting gender equality, combating HIV/AIDS and eradicating poverty. The UNFPA mandate on population and reproductive health, including sexual health and family planning is more relevant than ever, and deserves full support. Thus, it is imperative that the Fund's regular income continues to grow. Increased resources would enable UNFPA to expand its programmes to help countries attain the goals of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) and the Millennium Declaration. underscored that the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and reproductive health are inextricably linked. By increasing their contributions to UNFPA, Member States will enhance the Fund's ability to assist countries in addressing reproductive health issues, such as HIV/AIDS and maternal mortality, and thereby, in fulfilling the commitment made at the 2005 World Summit.

A. Income overview

3. The present report contains a number of tables and charts on UNFPA regular resources and cofinancing arrangements. Additional data are provided in the annexes. The donor income figures are inclusive of exchange gains and losses. To be able to meet the schedule for submission of the report to the Executive Board for the 2006 annual session, the data for 2005 in this document are based on information received and pledges recorded as of 1 March 2006. It should be noted that 2005 figures are provisional.

- 4. Table 1 shows that the year 2005 was a notable year for UNFPA with total resources (regular and co-financing) reaching about \$523.5 million, the Fund's highest total ever. The total income for UNFPA in 2005 was \$365.8 million in regular resources and \$157.7 million for co-financing arrangements. Compared to 2004, the increase in income for regular resources in 2005 was \$38.1 million, or 11.6 per cent. The increase in income for co-financing arrangements was \$26.6 million or 20.3 per cent. This represents an encouraging growth in contributions by donor and programme countries alike.
- 5. The income overview in table 1 is supplemented by annex 1, which provides detailed information on UNFPA 2005 provisional income as of 31 December 2005, actual pledges and the best estimates of contributions to UNFPA regular resources and a list of donors for the years 2006 and future years as of 1 March 2006. These commitments include the following: (a) pledges for 2006 only and multi-year pledges for 2006 and future years; (b) pledges for 2006 received during the United Nations Pledging Conference for 2006, held on 11 November 2005; and (c) letters received and verbal indications from Governments pledging support to UNFPA for the period 2006 to 2010.
- 6. UNFPA increased its donor base to 172 donor Governments in 2005 from 166 in 2004. Multiyear pledges have also increased to 55 in 2005 from 49 in 2004. It is noteworthy that out of the total 172 donor Governments, 11 countries belonging to the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)/Development Assistance Committee (DAC) and 28 programme countries have increased their contributions in national currency terms from the 2004 level, and 14 programme countries

have increased contributions in US dollar terms. UNFPA was particularly gratified to have received pledges in 2005 from all the countries in sub-Saharan Africa. This shows the broad support that UNFPA has enjoyed over the past few years and evidences a continuing growth of the UNFPA funding base. As of 1 March 2006, 98 official pledges had been received for this year. Details of the timing of the pledges are shown in annex 2.

7. In 2005, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, Japan and the United Kingdom were the five largest donors in US dollar terms. The substantial increase in the 2005 regular income level to \$365.8 million was due to larger contributions from 11 major donors, as well as a weakening of the US dollar vis-à-vis other currencies. The benefit from the favourable exchange rates of the euro and other major currencies against the US dollar in 2005 was \$12.8 million, i.e., a 3.7 per cent increase in regular contributions in 2005. Table 2 lists the countries that have increased their contributions in 2005 in national currency terms compared to 2004.

- 8. Further details on contributions from the Fund's top ten major donors to regular resources for the past five years are shown in annex 3.
- 9. As of 31 December 2005, out of the 172 donors to UNFPA regular resources, 17 major donors provided about 94 per cent of the total regular resources contributions to UNFPA. The percentage breakdown in US dollar terms is: Netherlands (20.7 per cent), Sweden (13.3 per cent), Norway (10.3 per cent), Japan (10.3 per cent), United Kingdom (10.0), Denmark (8.4 per cent), Germany (5.2 per cent), Finland (5.1 per cent), Canada (3.2 per cent), Switzerland (2.7 per cent), Belgium (1.0 per cent), Ireland (1.0 per cent), France (0.9 per cent), Italy (0.7 per cent), New Zealand (0.6 per cent), Australia (0.5 per cent), and Luxembourg (0.4 per cent). The remaining 155 donors, interest income and other income accounted for approximately 6 per cent of the total regular resources.

10. In view of the current informal indications from UNFPA major donors and some multi-year pledges already recorded, there will be decreases in the US dollar equivalent for 2006, using the current United Nations operational rate of exchange effective 1 March 2006. Preliminary projections for 2006 suggest that the contribution to regular resources is currently at \$341.7 million. This decrease originates essentially from an increase in the value of the US dollar against other currencies during the first quarter of 2006. Barring a few exceptions, donors have maintained or increased their level of contributions in local currency in 2006, compared to 2005. Early indications of increases in national currency terms from the 2005 contribution level were received from the countries listed in table 3. Table 3 is supplemented by annex 4.

B. <u>Co-financing contributions</u>

- 12. Over the last decade, other resources in the form of earmarked contributions to UNFPA-supported projects and programmes (also referred to as co-financing resources) have increased steadily in significance. However, in the last few years, the proportion of co-financing income remained stable at about 30 per cent of the total regular and co-financing resources.
- 13. In 2005, co-financing from programme country Governments continued to form a solid part of total co-financing income. In 2005, \$24.2 million was received, compared to \$12.8 million in 2004. The 2005 contributions were from Algeria, Botswana, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Equatorial Guinea, Guatemala, Lebanon, Malaysia, Morocco, Nigeria, Paraguay, Peru, Sao Tome and Principe, Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, Venezuela and Yemen. The five largest contributions in 2005 were received from Peru (\$19.8 million), Syrian Arab Republic (\$0.8 million), Nigeria (\$0.7 million), Guatemala (\$0.7 million) and Lebanon (\$0.4 million). The five largest contributions in 2004 were received from the following programme countries: Peru (\$8.0 million), Brazil (\$0.8 million), Colombia (\$0.6 million), Morocco (\$0.6 million) and Lebanon (\$0.4 million). Details on the co-financing contributions from these programme countries in support of their own country programmes are presented in annex 6 of this report.
- 14. As of 31 December 2005, co-financing income was \$157.7 million compared to the 2004 level of \$131.1 million. With reference to co-financing, the ten major donors for 2004 and 2005 are listed in table 5. Details on the complete list of donors to co-financing arrangements for 2005 are presented in annex 7.

- 15. <u>European Commission</u>. In 2005, the largest amount of co-financing contributions from an intergovernmental organization was received from the European Commission, totalling \$15.2 million. This included \$2.0 million from the European Commission Humanitarian Aid Office (ECHO).
- 16. Last year, UNFPA signed eight contribution agreements with the European Commission (five for development activities with EuropeAid, and three with ECHO for humanitarian response) totalling \$9.7 million. One of these contributions targets UNFPA-supported HIV-prevention activities among the armed forces in Côte d'Ivoire, others support two interregional conferences: an international conference on sexual violence and exploitation in war to be held in Brussels and the African Ministerial Conference on sexual and reproductive health, including reproductive health commodity security.
- 17. Under the 2005 European Commission call for proposals on aid for policies and actions on reproductive and sexual health in developing countries, UNFPA was awarded grants for activities focusing on young people's sexual and reproductive health in Malawi and Zimbabwe, as well as for a regional project covering Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia (signed in early 2006). The ECHO contributions supported UNFPA in addressing reproductive health needs in humanitarian emergencies, notably in the Darfur region of Sudan; in Indonesia, following the tsunami; and in Guatemala, following hurricane Stan.
- 18. Further, in the first half of 2006, the European Commission and UNFPA have signed a contribution agreement (euro 1.7 million) for humanitarian aid (emergency obstetric care and reproductive health services) following the earthquake in Pakistan, as well as a contribution agreement for euro 14.9 million for a joint programme of assistance to African, Caribbean and Pacific countries most in need of achieving reproductive health commodity security, and a contribution agreement for euro 3.9 million to support the fifth Sudan population census. ECHO support for further UNFPA activities in the Darfur region of Sudan is currently under negotiation.

C. Thematic funding

19. In 2005, two thematic funds were in operation and raised significant levels of funding for the campaign to end fistula and the reproductive health commodity security programme.

Campaign to end fistula

- 20. The campaign to end fistula has been successful both in raising the visibility of the issue of broader maternal health and in attracting a wide range of donors. To date, the campaign has mobilized \$13.8 million. New donors to the campaign in 2005 included Iceland, Poland and Spain (Autonomous Community of Catalunya). Additionally, private sector donors, including Virgin Unite and Johnson and Johnson continued their support of the campaign in 2005, through in kind and financial commitments. UNFPA intends to expand these partnerships in 2006. Individuals are also drawn to the thematic programme approach: the One by One project, a grassroots initiative (based in Seattle, USA) in partnership with the United Nations Foundation, raised more than \$130,000 in 2005 for the campaign and the full amount will be received by UNFPA this year. In December 2005, UNFPA submitted the fistula campaign's new programme proposal (totalling \$78.3 million for the period 2006–2010) to over 40 Governments.
- 21. Co-financing contributions received for the campaign to end fistula amounted to \$4.9 million in 2004 and \$4.8 million in 2005. Table 6 below lists the 2004 and 2005 donors in descending order.

Reproductive health commodity security programme

22. Co-financing contributions received for reproductive health commodity security amounted to \$38.6 million in 2004 and \$25.5 million in 2005. The 2004 and 2005 donors are listed in descending order in table 7.

D. Private sector initiatives and innovative sources of funding

- 23. UNFPA continued its efforts to mobilize additional resources from the private sector. In November 2005, UNFPA launched a new online donation tool on its website as well as on the website of the campaign to end fistula. A policy on pro bono contributions and guidelines for establishing partnerships with the business sector were issued in December 2005 and March 2006 respectively.
- 24. The total amount of co-financing contributions received from the private sector during the course of 2005 was \$2.9 million. Of this amount, \$2 million was contributed by Americans for UNFPA, (formerly known as the US Committee for UNFPA), a charitable organization which raises funds from foundations and individuals to support UNFPA work. Also, UNFPA was the direct recipient of donations from private corporations (\$114,671), foundations (\$282,943) and individuals (\$48,066).
- 25. In April 2006, in response to the invitation from Brazil and France, UNFPA joined the Pilot Group on Solidarity Contributions for Development and is actively participating in discussions on the creation of the International Drug Purchase Facility.

E. UNFPA as a United Nations partner in response to humanitarian crises

UNFPA consolidated appeal process and flash appeals for 2005

26. Through the appeals process, out of the requested \$92,434,783 million for 2005, UNFPA received \$39,586,650 (43 per cent funding for the year 2005). Appeals in 2005 that received the most funding were the tsunami and South Asia appeals. UNFPA tsunami projects were funded 87.3 per cent, (i.e., a total of \$27 million out of the requested \$31.0) and the South Asia appeal was funded 64 per cent (i.e., a total of \$5.9 million out of the requested \$9.3 million). The UNFPA flash appeal for Guatemala was funded 52.1 per cent (i.e., a total of \$338,888 out of the requested \$650,000). UNFPA projects in the

2005 workplan for Sudan were funded 14 per cent (i.e., a total of \$4.7 million out of the requested \$32.9 million).

27. Twenty-one per cent of UNFPA consolidated appeals were funded by Germany, followed by Japan at 17 per cent. Also, in 2005, there were several new donors for humanitarian aid projects, such as Greece, Kuwait, Liechtenstein and the Republic of Korea. The single largest contribution to UNFPA in 2005 was \$4 million from Germany for Indonesia (within the tsunami appeal). The Fund's own contributions for support to humanitarian appeals amounted to \$4.7 million in 2005 compared to \$3 million in 2004.

F. UNFPA resources, 2006–2007

28. Table 8 summarizes the income projection for the period 2006 to 2007. The UNFPA target for regular income in 2006 is \$366 million and for 2007 it is \$381 million. UNFPA will make every effort to increase income to the \$400 million level in the longer term. However, to reach this target, UNFPA needs the support and advocacy of its Executive Board members. The targets for 2006 and 2007 are consistent with the MYFF, 2004–2007, and the regular resource requirements for the biennium, 2006–2007. As of 1 March 2006, the projection for UNFPA regular resources in 2006 is at \$341.7. Currently, there is a projected shortfall of \$24.3 million for 2006. It is hoped that this could be minimized through increased contributions. Towards that end, UNFPA is striving to continue to broaden the funding base from DAC and non-DAC members and to reach out to the private sector.

Conclusion

- 29. UNFPA appeals to all donor Governments, particularly the major donors, for the timely submission of their pledges and payment schedules. In a number of cases, the inability to secure early and timely commitments and a firm payment schedule remains an obstacle to the Fund's ability to contribute more fully to the implementation of the ICPD Programme of Action and the achievement of the MDGs. It is clear that only through the active support and shared responsibility with the Executive Board members will UNFPA be able to ensure a more predictable cash flow and a stable income base to carry out its mission and mandate to assist countries in achieving the ICPD goals and the MDGs.
- 30. Annex 8 shows the growth of regular contributions based on local currencies received from UNFPA top donors for the period 2003 to 2006. The growth reflects the continuing support of the top

donors as well as their confidence in UNFPA. Nevertheless, the upward trend in regular resources remains extremely vulnerable to exchange rate fluctuations.

- 31. UNFPA values its close collaboration with the 172 donors contributing to the Fund and appreciates their commitment and generous support. It is in this spirit that UNFPA appeals to the members of the Executive Board and all members of the Fund's donor family to consider increasing their contributions for 2006 and future years to the highest level that their circumstances will permit.
- 32. The per capita contribution to UNFPA regular resources from the Fund's 17 top donors, i.e., those contributing \$1 million or more for 2005, is summarized in annex 9 of this report. It shows that Luxembourg, has the highest per capita share of contributions to UNFPA regular and co-financing resources, followed by Norway and Sweden.
- 33. It is essential that UNFPA continue to focus the bulk of its resource mobilization efforts on increasing regular resources. While obtaining increases in co-financing resources is important, the ability of UNFPA to mobilize such resources depends on the existence of a stable and secure multilateral funding base. It must be emphasized that regular resources remain the foundation and bedrock of the Fund's operations. UNFPA is steadfast in its belief that its resource mobilization philosophy and long-term strategy should be built on a strong and secure base of regular resources supplemented by various combinations of co-financing funding. This is critical to enable UNFPA to support countries in implementing the ICPD Programme of Action and achieving the MDGs and is essential for maintaining the universality, neutrality and multilateralism that characterize its work.

Elements for a decision

34. The Executive Board may wish to:

- (a) Take note of the present report (DP/FPA/2006/3) and welcome the substantial increase in the 2005 regular income level, as well as the increase in 2005 co-financing income, resulting from increased contributions from a number of donors; and also welcome the contributions made by programme countries, enabling UNFPA to reach its highest ever number of donors;
 - (b) Note with concern the current uncertainty of the financial situation for 2006;
- (c) Recognize that sustaining and improving the UNFPA funding level will require countries that are in a position to do so to augment their funding efforts during the period of the UNFPA MYFF, 2004–2007;
- (d) Emphasize that UNFPA needs strong political and financial support, as well as increased and predictable core funding, in order to enhance its assistance to countries to fully integrate the ICPD agenda into national development strategies in line with the 2005 World Summit Outcome:
- (e) Encourage all countries, in a position to do so, to make contributions early in the year and to make multi-year pledges;

(f) Reiterate that regular resources are the bedrock of UNFPA and essential to maintaining the multilateral, neutral and universal nature of its work;

(g) Encourage UNFPA to continue to mobilize supplementary resources for its programmes, bearing in mind that core resources remain the bedrock of the resource mobilization strategy of UNFPA.


