**FUNDING COMMITMENTS TO UNFPA:
REPORT ON CONTRIBUTIONS BY MEMBER STATES TO
REGULAR AND CO-FINANCING RESOURCES
FOR 2008 AND FUTURE YEARS**

Report of the Executive Director

Introduction

1. This report is prepared in response to Executive Board decisions 99/5 and 2000/9, which requested the Executive Director to provide annually updated estimates of regular resources and co-financing resources. In line with the UNFPA strategic plan, 2008–2011, the purpose of the present report is to promote dialogue between UNFPA and its Executive Board on the Fund's overall resource situation while continuing to address the important goal of increasing regular resources and achieving a stable and predictable resource base.

2. The 2005 World Summit reaffirmed universal access to reproductive health by 2015. With the inclusion of the target of universal access to reproductive health by 2015 (and its related indicators) in the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) monitoring framework, countries have the opportunity to better monitor the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) and the achievement of the MDGs. UNFPA is committed to supporting national efforts to integrate the target into national development plans, strategies and budgets.



3. The United Nations General Assembly resolution 62/208 on the triennial comprehensive policy review of operational activities for development of the United Nations system stresses that core resources, because of their untied nature, continue to be the bedrock of the operational activities for development of the United Nations system. The resolution urges donor countries and other countries in a position to do so to substantially increase their voluntary contributions to the core/regular budgets of the United Nations system, in particular to the funds and programmes, and to contribute on a multi-year basis, in a sustained and predictable manner. To this end, it is imperative that the Fund's regular income continues to grow. Increased resources would enable UNFPA to expand its programmes to assist countries in attaining the goals of the ICPD and the Millennium Declaration. By increasing their contributions to UNFPA, Member States will enhance the Fund's ability to support countries in nationally led and nationally owned efforts to improve the reproductive health and well-being of their people, including by reducing maternal and child mortality, addressing HIV/AIDS and enhancing gender equality and women's empowerment.

4. The present report contains tables and charts on UNFPA regular and co-financing resources. Additional data are provided in the annexes. The donor income figures are inclusive of exchange gains and losses. The data projected for 2008 in this document are based on information received and pledges recorded as of 1 March 2008. All 2007 data/figures used in this report are provisional.

5. In 2007, UNFPA attained its highest-ever income of total resources (regular and co-financing), reaching about \$715.3 million (table 1). The breakdown of this total income in 2007 was \$457.1 million in regular resources and \$258.2 million for co-financing resources. The regular resources income of \$457.1 million includes \$419.0 million in voluntary contributions, \$18.3 million from a private endowment trust, \$18.3 million in interest income, and other income of \$1.5 million. Compared with 2006, the increase in income for regular resources in 2007 was \$67.8 million, or 17.4 per cent. The co-financing income of \$258.2 million includes \$250.2 million in contributions, \$7.7 million in interest income, and other income of \$0.3 million. The increase in income for co-financing in 2007 was \$85.0 million, or 49.1 per cent. This represents an encouraging growth in contributions by donor and programme countries alike.

A. Income overview of regular resources

6. In December 2006, UNFPA signed a tripartite agreement with Americans for UNFPA (a non-governmental organization) and a private donor for the transfer of assets of a private endowment trust to UNFPA. As a result, through the Americans for UNFPA, the Fund received \$15.4 million in 2006 and \$18.3 million in 2007 in regular resources. However, as a condition of the transfer, only the interest of the trust fund will be used.

7. As of 1 March 2008, the projected regular contribution from donor governments for 2008 was \$467.9 million, an increase of \$10.8 million over the 2007 level, at the March 2008 exchange rate. UNFPA will continue to advocate for the increase in contributions with members of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)/Development Assistance Committee (DAC), and non-DAC members, including programme country governments. In mobilizing resources for its programmes, UNFPA will also continue to reach out to the private sector and foundations.

8. The income overview in table 1 is supplemented by annex 1, which provides detailed information on UNFPA 2007 provisional income as of 31 December 2007, actual pledges and the best estimates of contributions to UNFPA regular resources, and a list of donors for the years 2008 and future years, as of 1 March 2008. These commitments include the following: (a) pledges for 2008 only and multi-year pledges for 2009 and future years; (b) pledges for 2008 received during the United Nations Pledging Conference for 2008, held on 12 November 2007 in New York; and (c) letters received and verbal indications from governments pledging support to UNFPA for the period 2008 to 2012.

9. In 2007, UNFPA increased its donor base to 182 donor governments compared to 180 donors in 2006. The total number of multi-year pledges received in 2007 was 69. Out of the 182 donor governments, 19 countries belonging to OECD/DAC and 51 programme countries increased their contributions in national currency terms (for those pledges received in national currency terms) and US dollar terms (for those pledges received in US dollars). As evidence of the broad support that

UNFPA has enjoyed from Member States over the past years and the continuing growth of its funding base, it is worth noting that UNFPA received contributions in 2007 from all countries in sub-Saharan Africa. As of 1 March 2008, 97 official pledges had been received for the year, of which 44 were multi-year pledges. All multi-year pledges are listed in annex 3.

10. In 2007, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, the United Kingdom and Japan were the Fund's five largest donors in US dollar terms. The substantial increase in the 2007 total regular resources income level to \$457.1 million was due to larger contributions received from 12 major donors, and the weakening of the US dollar vis-à-vis other currencies. The benefit from the favourable exchange rates of the euro and other major currencies against the US dollar in 2007 was \$26.2 million, i.e., an increase of 6.7 per cent in regular contributions in 2007. Table 2 lists the countries that increased their contributions in 2007 in national currency terms compared to 2006.

11. Further details on contributions from the Fund's top 10 major donors to regular resources for the past eight years are shown in annex 2.

12. For the 2008 regular contribution income projections, informal indications from major donors to UNFPA and some multi-year pledges already recorded suggest that there will be increases in the US dollar equivalent in 2008. Early indications of increases in national currency terms from the 2007 contribution level were received from the countries listed in table 3.

B. Overview of co-financing contributions

13. Over the last decade, other resources in the form of earmarked contributions to UNFPA-supported projects and programmes, also referred to as co-financing resources, have increased steadily in absolute terms. However, in the last few years, the proportion of co-financing income of total resources has remained stable, at about 30 to 35 per cent. The breakdown of co-financing contributions by programme purposes is shown in annex 5.

Co-financing contributions from governments

14. In 2007, co-financing from programme country governments in support of their own country programmes continued to form a solid part of the total co-financing income. In 2007, \$14.3 million was received compared with \$26.5 million in 2006. The 2007 contributions were from Bahrain, Botswana, Brazil, Central African Republic, Colombia, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Georgia, Guatemala, Lebanon, Mexico, Morocco, Nigeria, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Sao Tome and Principe, Syrian Arab Republic and Ukraine. The five largest contributions in 2007 were received from Peru (\$8.1 million), Colombia (\$1.1 million), Syrian Arab Republic (\$0.9 million), Paraguay (\$0.6 million), and Mexico (\$0.5 million). Details on the contributions are presented in annex 4 of this report.

European Commission

15. In 2007, the largest amount of co-financing contributions from an intergovernmental organization was received from the European Commission, totalling \$41.8 million. This included \$1.4 million from the European Commission's Directorate-General for Humanitarian Aid (ECHO). Last year, UNFPA signed six new contribution agreements with the European Commission (three under the European Development Fund and three for humanitarian response), totalling \$25.9 million.

16. New agreements were signed for grants to support population and housing census activities in Burundi, Chad and Mozambique. New grant agreements were signed with ECHO for continued support of UNFPA activities in the Darfur region of Sudan, for support to conflict-affected populations of Nepal, and for the recovery process after the earthquake in Peru.

Co-financing contributions from other United Nations agencies

17. UNFPA received increased co-financing contributions from other United Nations agencies and entities. In 2007, UNFPA received \$10.6 million from UNAIDS, of which \$8.6 million was part of the Co-Sponsors' Unified Work Plan and Budget. Contributions received from other United Nations agencies totalled \$34.1 million. The top five donors were the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) (\$14.3 million), UNAIDS (\$10.8 million), UNDP (\$6.6 million), United Nations Fund for International Partnerships (UNFIP) (\$1.5 million), and UNICEF (\$0.5 million).

C. Thematic funding

18. Thematic funding is a modality whereby UNFPA enables donors to provide funding for core areas of its mandate, in support of the Fund's strategic plan. This funding modality supports the integration of selected programme themes with UNFPA corporate frameworks for results, programming and funding. It provides an alternative to traditional funding arrangements (regular and co-financing resources) by functioning as a faster and more flexible funding mechanism. While core funding provides the base for all UNFPA action – established systems, knowledge, expertise, coverage and partnership – thematic funds leverage existing systems for optimal efficiency and

effectiveness in their implementation. The predictability of resources in the thematic funds creates a unique opportunity to focus and scale up programming to help meet unmet needs. Also, contributing to thematic funds reduces transaction costs for national partners, donors and UNFPA.

Thematic funding for obstetric fistula

19. Since 2003, UNFPA has led the global Campaign to End Fistula, a collaborative initiative to prevent obstetric fistula and restore the health and dignity of those living with its consequences. The Campaign to End Fistula has been successful in raising the visibility of the broader issue of maternal health and in attracting a wide range of donors. In addition to donors with a history of support to UNFPA, new donors and partners have emerged, compelled by the human faces and the acute suffering brought to light through attention to obstetric fistula. The year 2007 was a landmark year for increased visibility, marked by a major advocacy initiative in Belgium, as well as private fund-raising events in the United Kingdom and the United States of America, which resulted in cash donations and pledges of more than \$1 million. In recognition of the Campaign's accomplishments in raising public awareness of obstetric fistula, the European Voice awarded UNFPA with the "2008 EV 50 Award", amounting to euro 32,000.

20. As the Campaign has matured, donors have become increasingly confident in the pooled funding modality, such that by 2007 the percentage of overall contributions to the Campaign through pooled funding exceeded 75 per cent. To date, the Campaign has mobilized more than \$28 million. In 2007, new donors included the Autonomous Community of Catalonia, Ireland, Norway, Republic of Korea, and the Arab Gulf Programme for United Nations Development Organizations (AGFUND), the non-profit regional development institution established by the Arab Gulf States. Through the United Nations Foundation (UNF), the Campaign to End Fistula plans to launch United States-based awareness-raising and advocacy in 2008. Virgin Unite, a private-sector donor, continued to support the Campaign in 2007, as did Johnson and Johnson, which also provided funding (and in-kind support) in 2008.

21. Co-financing contributions received for the Campaign to End Fistula amounted to \$8.7 million in 2007 and \$5.2 million in 2006. Table 5 lists the 2006 and 2007 donors in descending order.

Thematic fund for reproductive health commodity security

22. Co-financing contributions received for the Global Programme to Enhance Reproductive Health Commodity Security amounted to \$14.0 million in 2006 and \$26.7 million in 2007. The 2006 and 2007 donors are listed in descending order in table 6.

23. Currently, the Global Programme is being implemented in the following priority countries: Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Mongolia, Mozambique and Nicaragua. In 2008, UNFPA plans to add four more priority countries. In addition, in 2007, UNFPA supported some 55 countries in enhancing reproductive health commodity security.

Thematic fund for maternal health

24. Towards the end of 2007, UNFPA established the thematic fund for maternal health aiming at scaling up UNFPA and partners' response to MDG 5 on improving maternal health. The thematic fund (2008-2015) will focus ultimately on supporting 75 countries with the greatest need. The thematic fund has an indicative budget for the first period (2008-2011) of \$465 million, exclusive of indirect costs, focusing on a phased implementation at scale in at least 25 of the 75 priority countries. Phasing in of the remaining countries will continue over the second period (2012-2015), as resources permit and based on a proposal and budget reflecting the experiences of the first period. The first donor to the thematic fund was Ireland (\$2.9 million). Spain also made a commitment of euro 6 million (approximately \$9.1 million using the United Nations exchange rate effective 1 March 2008).

D. Contributions from the private sector

25. The total amount of co-financing contributions received from the private sector during 2007 was \$3.1 million. Of this amount, \$0.4 million was contributed through Americans for UNFPA. Also, UNFPA was the direct recipient of donations from private corporations (\$1.4 million), foundations (\$1.1 million) and individuals (\$0.3 million). The contribution of the Hewlett Foundation in the amount of \$1.5 million for advocacy activities in 2007 was channelled through UNFIP.

E. Contributions to UNFPA components of United Nations humanitarian appeals in 2007

26. In 2007, UNFPA received co-financing resources to address emergencies/humanitarian crises in 63 countries and territories: Angola, Bangladesh, Belarus, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Colombia, Côte d'Ivoire, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Dominican Republic, Egypt, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Fiji, Georgia, Guatemala, Guinea, Haiti, Honduras, Indonesia, Islamic Republic of Iran, Jamaica, Jordan, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Liberia, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Malaysia, Mauritania, Mexico, Moldova, Mozambique, Namibia, Nepal, Nicaragua, Niger, Occupied Palestinian Territory, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Rwanda, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Syrian Arab Republic, Sudan, Swaziland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Timor-Leste, Togo, Uganda, Ukraine, Yemen and Zimbabwe.

27. With the increasing demands placed on UNFPA and its partners to respond to events and situations not provided for in regular country programming, an increasing proportion of financing for humanitarian and recovery activity is coming from other sources. Co-financing contributions for such activities amounted to more than \$49.5 million in 2007. The countries/territories receiving the largest share of these resources, in descending order, were the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Sudan, Burundi, Occupied Palestinian Territory and Somalia. In 2007, OCHA contributed \$14.3 million to UNFPA-supported country-level activities, including \$8.5 million from the United Nations Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF).

28. From 2006 to 2007, total funding from CERF increased from \$1.7 million to \$8.5 million. CERF funding particularly benefited under-funded appeals, thus constituting an important supplement to other funding sources. UNFPA also benefited from other funds managed by OCHA in 2007, totalling \$5.8 million.

Conclusion

29. In line with the recommendations of General Assembly resolution 62/208 on the triennial comprehensive policy review of operational activities of the United Nations development system, UNFPA is steadfast in its belief that its resource mobilization strategy should focus on regular resources, which are the bedrock of the Fund's operations, supplemented by various combinations of co-financing funding. A stable base of regular resources is critical to enable UNFPA to support countries in implementing the ICPD Programme of Action and achieving the MDGs. It is also essential for maintaining the universality, neutrality and multilateralism that characterize UNFPA efforts to carry out its mandate as a trusted and valued partner exerting influence far beyond the modest resources it is able to provide.

30. In 2007, the number of co-financing agreements signed by UNFPA increased to 230 compared with 170 in 2006, and the number of co-financing donors increased to 85 from 78 in 2006. Co-financing income also increased to \$258.2 million in 2007 from \$173.2 million in 2006. As stated in General Assembly resolution 62/208, the growth of extra-budgetary funding and of the number of associated projects increases transaction costs for all organizations and is a significant factor that might hinder the effort to maximize efficiency of the United Nations development system. UNFPA is mindful of this and maintains an even balance between regular and co-financing resources. During 2000–2004, the level of co-financing resources has remained at 30 per cent of total contributions, and grew to 35 per cent in 2007. Thus, the balance between regular resources and co-financing resources received during the period 2000 to 2007 has remained between 30 and 35 per cent. Although obtaining increases in co-financing resources is important, the ability of UNFPA to mobilize such resources depends on the existence of a stable and secure multilateral funding base.

31. UNFPA values its close collaboration with the Executive Board and all donor Governments and appreciates their commitment, continued cooperation and unwavering support. It is in this spirit that UNFPA appeals to the Fund's donor family to support the multi-year funding format as urged in General Assembly resolution 62/208, and as supported in Executive Board decisions 2003/19, 2004/24, 2005/24, 2006/12 and 2007/13. Such support is critical in ensuring predictable and sustainable funding to enable UNFPA to plan and deliver its multi-year programmes. Two years ago, eight major donors, contributing \$1 million and over, submitted multi-year pledges for 2006 and future years. These were Belgium, Canada, Finland, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Switzerland and the United Kingdom. The multi-year term of all these donors ended last year, and as of 1 March 2008, New Zealand is the only major donor in the multi-year pledge list for 2008 and future years. Thus, it is hoped that additional donors will come on board this year and submit multi-year pledges as the Fund implements the new strategic plan, 2008–2011, which serves as the main guiding force for UNFPA programming, management and accountability at the global, regional and country levels.

32. The increasing trend of regular and co-financing resources over the past five years provides an affirmation of the broad political support extended to UNFPA by the Member States and is reflected in the Fund's growing donor base (182 donors in 2007). However, two factors are important to keep in mind: the impact of the exchange rate and a still too narrow funding base whereby the Fund depends on its top 10 major donors for about 90 per cent of all regular resources. Recognizing this context, the progress achieved with regard to increased regular resources needs to be sustained to keep pace with the growing demands for the Fund's services. Clearly, the capacity of the Fund to deliver depends on a robust funding base.

33. In accordance with the integrated financial resources framework of the new UNFPA strategic plan, 2008–2011, the approved resource requirements for all resources (regular and other) amount to \$2.6 billion for the four-year period. The framework for 2008–2011 increases the proportion and amount of resources directed to country programmes over the multi-year funding framework 2004–2007, and UNFPA will make every effort to focus any real income growth primarily at the country level during the four-year period. If UNFPA is to succeed in its endeavours to effectively implement its country programmes and support countries in achieving the MDGs and the ICPD goals, its regular resources will need to annually exceed the \$450 million level, and its other resources the \$200 million level. All countries are encouraged to translate their commitment to achieving these goals into increased contributions to UNFPA through regular and other resources, including thematic funding, and through multi-year pledges.

Elements for a decision

34. **The Executive Board may wish to:**

(a) **Take note of the present report (DP/FPA/2008/9) and welcome the substantial increase in the Fund's 2007 regular income level, as well as the increase in its 2007 co-financing income;**

(b) **Emphasize that regular resources are the bedrock of UNFPA and essential to maintaining the multilateral, neutral and universal nature of its work, and encourage UNFPA to further mobilize these resources while also continuing to mobilize supplementary resources for its programmes;**

(c) **Recognize that sustaining and improving the UNFPA funding level will require countries that are in a position to do so to augment their funding efforts during the period of the new UNFPA strategic plan, 2008-2011;**

(d) **Encourage all countries that are in a position to do so to make contributions early in the year and make multi-year pledges;**

(e) **Emphasize that UNFPA needs strong political and increased financial support as well as increased and predictable core funding in order to enhance its assistance to countries to fully integrate the ICPD agenda into national development strategies and frameworks.**
