6. Proposals for UNICEF programme cooperation**(a) Approval of the revised common country programme document for the United Republic of Tanzania***For action [DP/FPA-ICEF-WFP/DCCP/2011/TZA/1]*

At the 2011 first regular session, the Executive Board discussed the draft common country programme document of the United Republic of Tanzania. The comments made were shared with the country office, and the UNICEF component was revised as appropriate and posted on the UNICEF website within six weeks of the session. In accordance with Executive Board decision 2010/9, the Executive Board will approve the UNICEF component of the common country programme document on a no-objection basis unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing of their wish to bring the common country programme document before the Executive Board for discussion.

(b) Draft country, common country and area programme documents*For action*

At this session, the Executive Board will consider a total of 24 draft country, common country, and area programme documents. In addition, there are two recommendations for funding from other resources only. These are presented to the Executive Board for discussion and comment, and for approval of the aggregate totals of estimated regular and other resources in the programme budget. The summary results matrix for each country programme document is posted on the UNICEF Executive Board website, and the United Nations Development Assistance Framework results matrices are available through the UNICEF Executive Board website, where applicable. Also available on the website, in accordance with Executive Board decision 2008/17, are the consolidated results and performance data for the previous programme cycles of each of the 24 draft country, common country, and area programmes.

Taking into account the comments made at the annual session, the draft country and area programme documents will be revised and posted on the UNICEF Executive Board website, at the latest, six weeks after the annual session for further review by members of the Executive Board. The revised country, common country, and area programme documents will be approved by the Executive Board on a no-objection basis at the 2011 second regular session unless at least five members have informed the secretariat in writing of their wish to bring a particular country programme before the Executive Board.

In accordance with Executive Board decision 2008/17, the Executive Board will be informed of the reasons for deferment of the presentation of 15 draft country programme documents from the annual session to the second regular session of 2011 (E/ICEF/2011/CRP.11).
