Global Framework on Chemicals Fund and status of contributions

Note by the secretariat

I. Introduction

1. At its fifth session, held in Bonn, Germany, in September 2023, the International Conference on Chemicals Management adopted resolution V/3 on financial considerations.
2. In the resolution, the Conference, among other things, established the Global Framework on Chemicals Fund for supporting the Global Framework on Chemicals – for a Planet Free of Harm from Chemicals and Waste. In accordance with the terms of reference of the Fund, an Executive Board was established as the Fund's decision-making body.

II. Activities to implement the resolution

3. The secretariat of the Global Framework on Chemicals has provided administrative services and other support to the Fund, including facilitating meetings of the Executive Board, launching the first round of applications, screening applications for eligibility and completeness, and conducting a high-level review of each application.
4. The Executive Board of the Fund has held three meetings to date. The first took place on 8 and 9 April 2024¹ and the second from 12 to 14 June 2024.² Key outcomes of those meetings were the agreement on the ad interim composition of the Executive Board; the workplan, staffing and budget of the Fund's secretariat; and the adoption of the strategic priorities for the Fund and the relevant documents for the first round of applications. The third meeting was split into two sessions: the first was held from 19 to 21 March 2025 in Geneva, and the second will be held online from 26 to 28 May 2025. The outcomes of those meetings will be presented orally to the Open-ended Working

Group and set out in document UNEP/GFC/OEWG.1/INF/5, on issues pertaining to the Global Framework on Chemicals Fund.

5. The first round of applications to the Fund was launched on 1 October 2024, with a closing date of 31 January 2025. The launch was accompanied by a United Nations Environment Programme press release,³ three webinars for applicants, and broader awareness-raising across various sectors and regions, which are described in document UNEP/GFC/OEWG.1/INF/5. To support applicants during the project development phase, the secretariat provided a “frequently asked questions” document⁴ and operated a help desk that provided assistance via email and in one-on-one consultations.

6. In the first round, a total of 105 applications were received, of which 80 were found to be complete and eligible for consideration by the Board at its session held from 19 to 21 March 2025. Further information on the applications can be found in document UNEP/GFC/OEWG.1/INF/5.

7. Table 1 shows the contributions and pledges to the Fund as at March 2025.

8. At its second meeting, the Executive Board approved a staffing and budget table for 2024 and 2025. The table was refined to reflect the year 2026 and presented to the Executive Board; it is pending final approval. Table 2 presents a comparative budget showing the budget approved at the second meeting of the Executive Board, actual expenditures for 2024, and updated figures for 2025 and 2026.

9. During its deliberations, the Executive Board raised the question of lack of clarity in paragraph A.1 of the annex to resolution V/3. As the International Conference on Chemicals Management adopted resolution V/3 after adopting resolution V/12 on the programme of work and budget, there was no provision either for staff to provide services for the Executive Board or for the related administrative activities required to make the Fund operational. On the basis of an assessment of what was needed to make the Fund operational, a staffing table and a workplan were proposed by the secretariat and agreed to by the Executive Board at its second meeting. An ad interim programme of work and budget were approved by the Executive Board and will remain in place until the International Conference of the Global Framework on Chemicals takes a decision on the final terms of reference of the Fund.

III. Proposed action

10. The Open-ended Working Group may wish to:

- (a) *Commend* the Executive Board for its work to operationalize the Global Framework on Chemicals Fund and its first round of applications;
- (b) *Express appreciation* to donors and contributors for their contributions and pledges to the Fund;
- (c) *Take note* of the guidelines adopted by the Executive Board and invite the Executive Board to update them as necessary;
- (d) *Reaffirm* the importance of reviewing the provisionally adopted terms of reference of the Fund, taking into account the assessment referred to in paragraph 2 of resolution V/3 and the lessons learned since the fifth session of the International Conference on Chemicals Management;
- (e) *Also reaffirm* the decision on the ad interim composition of the Executive Board, which was adopted on 24 January 2024 through the silence procedure;
- (f) *Take note* of document UNEP/GFC/OEWG.1/INF/5, which provides an update on the third meeting of the Executive Board and on the projects approved under the first round of applications;
- (g) *Reiterate* its invitation, contained in paragraph 14 of resolution V/3, to all Governments in a position to do so and other stakeholders to provide financial contributions to ensure that the Fund remains adequately resourced to support countries in implementing the Global Framework on Chemicals.
