Extensions of ongoing country programmes

Note by the secretariat

Summary

In accordance with Executive Board decision 2009/11, this note informs the Executive Board of the first one-year extension of the country programme for Algeria; and the first two-month extension of the country programme for Côte d'Ivoire, as approved by the Executive Director.

This note further presents the reasons for the proposed three-month extension of the country programme for the Syrian Arab Republic, following two previous one-year extensions and one nine-month extension. The Executive Board is requested to approve this programme extension.

Draft decision

The Executive Board

- 1. Takes note of the first one-year extension of the country programme for Algeria; and the first two-month extension of the country programme for Côte d'Ivoire, both of which were approved by the Executive Director and are presented in table 1;
- 2. Approves the three-month extension of the country programme for the Syrian Arab Republic, following two previous one-year extensions and one ninemonth extension, as presented in table 2.

			The country office's existing programme focus remains unchanged and will maintain the same programme components as the original country programme document (CPD) for 2016–2020, with a specific emphasis on the most vulnerable children and adolescents.
Côte d'Ivoire	2017–2020	January to February 2021 (two-month extension)	 A two-month extension will enable the UNICEF Côte d'Ivoire Country Office to fully align the new CPD with the National Development Plan 2021–2025 and the UNSDCF priorities. The extension will also allow UNICEF Côte d'Ivoire to continue its cooperation with the Government based on the current CPD, covering the gap between its completion on 31 December 2020 and approval of the new country programme. The scope, strategies, programmes, budget and staffing structure of the country programme will remain unchanged.

The country programme will continue to work in accordance with the results framework of the approved CPD and in line with the UNSF. Additionally, the country programme will continue to complement the work of the United Nations under the Humanitarian Response Plan for the Syrian Arab Republic.
