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Letter dated 22 July 2009 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to refer to article 13 bis, paragraph 2, of the Statute of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991, which reads as follows:

“In the event of a vacancy in the Chambers amongst the permanent judges elected or appointed in accordance with this article, after consultation with the Presidents of the Security Council and of the General Assembly, the Secretary-General shall appoint a person meeting the qualifications of article 13 of the Statute, for the remainder of the term of office concerned.”

In this connection, I should like to recall that Judges Mohamed Shahabuddeen (Guyana), Iain Bonomy (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) and Christine Van Den Wyngaert (Belgium) have resigned effective 10 May, 31 August and 1 September respectively.

The Government of Belgium has nominated Mr. Guy Delvoie to replace Judge Van Den Wyngaert. The Government of the United Kingdom has nominated Mr. Howard Morrison to replace Judge Bonomy. In this regard, please note that earlier this year, after indicating my intentions to the Security Council, I appointed Mr. Morrison as judge of the Special Tribunal for Lebanon. However, in the light of the difficulty of finding judges with the necessary experience to take up the appointment to the International Tribunal in the required short time frame, and given that judges of the Special Tribunal are unlikely to start their functions until the first quarter of 2010, the Government of the United Kingdom has decided to nominate Mr. Morrison for the position of judge of the International Tribunal. Mr. Morrison resigned as judge of the Special Tribunal effective 14 July 2009.

As regards the replacement of Judge Shahabuddeen, the Government of Guyana indicated that it was not in a position to nominate a candidate to replace him. It has therefore requested that we ask other States of that region for possible nominees. As a result of those consultations, the Government of the Bahamas has nominated as a permanent judge Sir Burton Hall, currently an ad litem judge at the International Tribunal not yet assigned to any cases.



Please find attached the curricula vitae of Mr. Guy Delvoie, Mr. Howard Morrison and Sir Burton Hall (see annex).*

It is my view that the above candidates meet the qualifications prescribed in article 13 of the Statute of the International Tribunal. I also consider that their appointment would ensure adequate representation on the Tribunal of the principal legal systems of the world, as contemplated in article 13 bis 1 (c) of the Statute.

In accordance with article 13 bis, paragraph 2, of the Statute of the International Tribunal, I look forward to receiving your views on the appointment of Mr. Delvoie, Mr. Morrison and Sir Burton Hall, as permanent judges of the International Tribunal.

**Sir Burton Hall, Kt., KSS,
Chief Justice and Head of the Judiciary
(5 September 2001-present)
Commonwealth of the Bahamas**

Birth: Nassau, The Bahamas, 10 December 1947

Education:

Sir Burton received an LL. B degree, with Honours, from the University of the West Indies in 1974 and the Legal Education Certificate of the Council of Legal Education of the West Indies in 1976.

Professional Life:

Sir Burton began his public service career in 1968 and served as a Probation Officer and Clerk in the House of Assembly before he began his legal studies.

He entered the Office of the Attorney General as an Assistant Counsel following his admission to the Bar in 1976. He progressed through the ranks of that Office (acting as a Stipendiary and Circuit Magistrate for two years) and held the post of Solicitor General when he was appointed to act as a Justice of the Supreme Court in October of 1990. As Solicitor General, he represented The Bahamas at several regional conferences dealing with drug trafficking and economic crimes.

He was confirmed as a Justice of the Supreme Court with effect from 1 February 1991 and served in that office (presiding over criminal, civil, constitutional and family matters) until he was appointed to the Court of Appeal on 1 April 1997. He demitted office as a Justice of Appeal on 4 September 2001 in order to assume his present post as Chief Justice and Head of the Judiciary.

During 1998, Mr. Justice Hall, as he referred to then, was appointed Chairman of the National Crime Commission. The Commission presented its report to the Government on 30 November of that year.

In 1999 Sir Burton was appointed to serve a three-year term as a member of the Administrative Tribunal of the Inter-American Development Bank, and, in 2002, was appointed for a further, and final, three-year term which ended in 2004.

In August of 2005, Sir Burton was elected by the General Assembly of the United Nations an *ad litem* Judge to the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY).

In addition to his present duties, he is also Course Director in Constitutional Law and Legal Systems at the Eugene Dupuch Law School, Council of Legal Education.

In June of 2002, having completed the programme of the Commonwealth Judicial Education Institute at Dalhousie University School of Law, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, Sir Burton became a Fellow of that Institute.

Honours and Awards:

As is customary in The Bahamas, on becoming Chief Justice, Sir Burton was made a Knight Bachelor by Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II (who has continued as the constitutional Head of State of The Bahamas since Independence in 1973).

In 2003, he was made a Knight of the Order of St Sylvester by His Holiness, Pope John Paul II. In 2004, Sir Burton was awarded the Pelican Alumni Peer award as outstanding alumnus of the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus.
