Letter dated 28 June 2010 from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to write to you, in my capacity as Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities, regarding the status of the review of the names on the Consolidated List pursuant to resolution 1822 (2008).

As you will be aware, by paragraph 25 of resolution 1822 (2008) the Security Council directed the Committee to conduct a review of all 488 entries on the Consolidated List as at the date of adoption of that resolution by 30 June 2010.

By the 30 June deadline, the Committee will have initiated the review of all 488 names and placed them on the agenda for discussion within the Committee. To date, the Committee has concluded the review of 362 names (approximately 75 per cent). Regarding the remaining names, the Committee has not yet been able to conclude the review.

I would therefore be grateful if the Security Council could take note of these developments and agree to extend the period of the review for one more month, until 31 July 2010.
