Report of New Zealand regarding the implementation of Security Council resolution 2206 (2015)

Under paragraph 17 of resolution 2206 (2015), the Security Council calls upon all Member States to report to the Committee 90 days from the adoption of the resolution on the steps that they have taken to implement effectively paragraphs 9 and 12 of the resolution.

New Zealand wishes to inform the Committee that it is implementing resolution 2206 (2015) by issuing the United Nations Sanctions (South Sudan) Regulations 2015, promulgated under the United Nations Act 1946. The Regulations were gazetted on 4 June 2015 and will enter into force on 2 July.

Implementation of paragraphs 9 and 12 of resolution 2206 (2015)

The Regulations will implement the travel ban under paragraph 9 of resolution 2206 (2015) through regulation 4, which prevents the entry into or transit through New Zealand by designated persons, except where their entry or transit is permitted by the Committee, in accordance with paragraphs 11 (a), (b) and (c) of the resolution.

The Regulations will implement the asset freeze imposed under paragraph 12 of resolution 2206 (2015) through regulations 5 to 7, which prohibit dealing in property of designated persons or sending property to designated persons, except in accordance with paragraphs 13 (a), (b) and (c) of the resolution.
