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Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#) concerning the Central African Republic

Report of India on the implementation of Security Council resolutions 2127 (2013) and 2134 (2014)

The Government of India published an Order dated 16 May 2016 on the implementation of Security Council resolutions on the Central African Republic in the Gazette of India.¹ The Order was published in order to incorporate into Indian domestic law the sanctions against the Central African Republic established by the Security Council in its resolutions 2127 (2013) and 2134 (2014).

Arms embargo

The Order prevents the direct or indirect supply, sale or transfer by all Member States to the Central African Republic from or through their territories or by their nationals, or using their flag vessels or aircraft, of arms and related materiel of all types, including weapons and ammunition, military vehicles and equipment, and paramilitary equipment and spare parts for the aforementioned, and technical assistance, training, financial or other assistance related to military activities or the provision, maintenance or use of any arms and related materiel, including the provision of armed mercenary personnel whether or not they originate in their territories. It requires the seizing, registry and disposal (such as destruction, rendering inoperable, storage or transfer to a State other than the originating or destination States for disposal) of items the supply, sale, transfer or export of which is prohibited by paragraph 1 of Security Council resolution 2196 (2015). Exemptions are provided in accordance with the above-mentioned resolutions.

Travel ban

The Order prevents the entry into or transit through the territories of all Member States of individuals designated by the Committee, while providing that it will not be obligatory for the Government of India to refuse its own nationals entry into Indian territory. Exemptions are provided in accordance with the above-mentioned resolutions.

Asset freeze

The Order provides for the freezing without delay of all funds, other financial assets and economic resources which are on the territories of all Member States and which are owned or controlled, directly or indirectly, by the individuals or entities designated by the Committee, or by individuals or entities acting on their behalf or at their direction, or by entities owned or controlled by them. It also ensures that funds, financial assets or economic resources are prevented from being made available by their nationals or by any individuals or entities within their territories to or for the benefit of the individuals or entities designated by the Committee. Exemptions are provided in accordance with the above-mentioned resolutions.
