## Statement

The young women and girls of Bangladesh are very hardworking and sharp-sighted. Youth are calling the power of nation. Nation expansion depends on young progress. The impact of COVID-19 has been a global problem that young people in Bangladesh have been able to deal with a lot of individual initiative. If the State could coordinate with the youth here, we could be more successful.

Need to build a bridge between the young women and State. It is important to create more opportunities for them, especially to combine their thinking with the thinking of the world.

It is very important to provide scientific education to young women and girls in order to engage climate change policy. In the future, our young people are working hard to establish themselves as entrepreneurs. The hope is that men are helping women to become entrepreneurs. At this time, if the State and development agencies can stand by the side of women, then women will not be left behind.

The Youth Foundation of Bangladesh has recently undertaken various programmes for women's entrepreneurship where workshops, seminars and training are preparing them to become entrepreneurs. Men as well as women can play a strong role by participating equally at home and outside of home if the State and various organizations stand by young women and girls.
