LETTER FROM THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS
OF THE GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN ADDRESSED TO
THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL DATED
20 JANUARY 1948

Sir,

I beg to request that a meeting of the Security Council may be called at as early a date as possible to consider the situations (other than the Jammu and Kashmir situation) set out in my letter dated January 15, 1948, addressed to the Secretary General. All these situations have led to a very acute crisis between India and Pakistan. More particularly the continued occupation by the armed forces of India of the State of Junagadh, which is part of Pakistan, and the oppression and spoliation of its Muslim population constitute a casus belli and may necessitate military action on the part of Pakistan unless urgent action is taken by the Security Council.
